The following is an email from June Tanaka Oshiro

Kei and I attended the World Premiere of “Dawn’s Light. The Journey of Gordon Hirabayashi” by Jennifer Sakata at the East West Players in Little Tokyo, downtown Los Angeles. His remarkable journey spanning four decades made us all familiar with his fascination and frustration with our Constitution that he had. I felt privileged to have been able to see this remarkable play starring Ryun Yu who was the sole participant in a one hour and 45 minute program with no intermission.

To quote Gordon’s brother, James Hirabayashi, Professor Emeritus of Anthropology and Ethnic Studies at the San Francisco State University; “Gordon’s principled stand against the unconstitutional actions of our government against Japanese Americans during World War II left an indelible imprint on my life and has influenced actions regarding my identity as a Japanese American in our American society.

Jeanne Sakata’s “Dawn’s Light” is about Gordon, his family and community as he matures into adulthood. It specifically focuses on Gordon as he makes momentous decisions which were to impact the lives of Japanese Americans during the critical World War II era.

Gordon, as a role model, influenced my actions during the tumultuous civil rights era including the strike at San Francisco State University to establish the first Ethnic Studies program in the country. It was a struggle to legitimize our identity as Japanese Americans in American society.

It is particularly crucial that we give free rein to the development of the humanities and creative arts, for the free expression of the life experiences is the basis upon which ethnic education builds new knowledge. Jeanne Sakata and the East West Players are to be commended for contributing to the self knowledge of Asian Americans. In light of the continuing existence of racisms in our society, we need these expressions of legitimacy of ethnic lives in our multicultural society.”

I hope we will be able to view the first public US screening “Cages”, Mako Iwamatsu’s last leading role, this month at the Aratani/Japan America Theater. Mako was the first Artistic Director of the East West Players. We were saddened when the last play in which he was to act in at the East West Players was cancelled due to his illness before his death.

Combine dashi, soy sauce, sugar and salt. Bring to boil. Add green onions and daikon.
