THIS-N-THAT FROM LAST WE MET

>>> We are looking forward to one of our newest members, Jack Roberts returning to our meeting next week after his recent illness.....A guest at last week's meeting was Andy Gillian. Andy was seen filling out a membership request. It appears our Membership Committee continues to work hard to bring in new Kiwanians.....Our speakers this day, Nicole Evans and Terrell Valentine, reminded us of the ever increasing need to provide for those experiencing "Hard Times" and their need for the basics of life - both food and shelter. The Bishop Cosgrove Center provides personal caring with 420 meals each day, breakfast and lunch, at their homeless guest shelter at 1736 Superior Avenue. The guests are provided a place to sleep and shower but must leave the building by 7am. The Center is funded through Catholic Charities, special grants and the United Way with an annual budget of \$500,000.....The city of Lakewood had 716 evictions in 2004 and 894 in 2006.....Program arrangements for the months of November and December are provided through the efforts of "Tex" Phillips.

"Learn Through Play" is yet another way the Kiwanis Club of Lakewood hopes to work in support of children in the community through Young Children Priority One, (YCPO).

"The "Learn Through Play" project will target parents/caregivers and their children to age five who are not in a formal early care and education setting. Programming will be offered two mornings per week for a total of 48 weeks. The program is designed to foster literacy-based, age-appropriate, interactive play between parents/caregivers and children. In addition to participating activities at the center, parents/caregivers will learn skills and activities that will transfer to everyday family life."

Next week's Kiwanis-Gram will include additional details on how the KCL will be supporting this new community service project and how members can become involved.
