#### **OBJECTIVES**

- gain skills to identify opportunities, which incorporate literacy learning and interaction into children's daily activities; and
- learn to identify and access community resources, which assist in meeting basic needs, improve self-sufficiency and decrease isolation.

##### **II. Children will:**

- spend dedicated time with their parent/caregiver in a developmentally appropriate environment; and
- utilize activity centers to develop pre-literacy skills.

##### **III. Kiwanis Club of Lakewood will commit to:**

- financial support to this project;
- recruitment of prospective volunteers; and
- dedicated meeting time on a quarterly basis for project update.
