Halloween at the "Y"

Anna Bacho has a signup sheet available today and is looking for several KCL members to help with the Halloween party at the Lakewood "Y" on October 23. Great fun while helping the youngsters enjoy the party is guaranteed for all those who attend.

The KCL responds to the Kiwanis International's Request for a New Worldwide Project.

In response to Kiwanis International's request for suggestions for a new international service project, the Kiwanis Club of Lakewood, Ohio proposes Kiwanis raise money to supply mosquito nets to children vulnerable to Malaria.

This project would be pivotal to the millions of children who are susceptible to this illness.

Malaria causes high fever (102-104), shaking chills, exhaustion, aches, vomiting, nausea, diarrhea, anemia, (which can also increase the rate of HIV/AIDS in a community), convulsions, organ failure, coma, and death. It impacts education, foreign trade, investment, tourism, available work force, forces population growth and increases the poverty rate in an affected area.

Nets treated with a long-lasting insect repellent and easily hung over a bed or hammock; cost about \$5 -\$10. A simple net has been shown to decrease the infection rate of Malaria by 50 percent. At the time of this writing, there have been 281,626,837 new cases of Malaria this year worldwide- it is one of the world's leading illnesses, causing over one million deaths per year, mostly to children under the age of five. In Africa alone, a child dies every 30 seconds from Malaria in as little as 24 hours after being bitten by an infected mosquito.

The number of children who can be protected by a simple net is staggering.

Kiwanis International has proven it can impact the world with something as simple as Iodine. Let's impact the world with another simple idea, insecticide-treated mosquito nets.
